

	Description of non-state assistance	Observation Date
Description of foreign assistance	The project " Assistance to Belarus to handle increased irregular migration" was registered in August 2018. The project is funded by the European Union and is implemented by the International Organization for Migration Office in Belarus in cooperation with the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the State Border Committee. The budget of the project is €7 million. The project seeks to enable voluntary return of migrants to their homeland without deportation. The border guard service will also receive vehicles to transport migrants. The project provides for the construction of new centers and also renovation of the existing ones.	2018
